OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY




Toileting

It is a self-help skill that is defined as the **obtaining**, **use of toilet** supplies, managing of clothes, toilet positioning, bladder and **bladder control**. -OTPF (Occupational Therapy Practice Framework) 3

Practice self-help skills, dressing:

- This can be very much evident when pulling down trousers and pants to pee and poo during toileting and pulling up trousers and pants after.
- Backward chaining is when the adult begins a task and then the student finishes it.
- Example: The adult puts on the shirt, places his/her arms on the arm holes while the student will be the one to pull the shirt down.





What can I do to encourage and support my child to answer questions?

- Make sure you have your child's attention before asking question or giving an instruction.
- Give your child time to think and understand your question.
- Include your child in as many conversations as possible. Ask direct questions relating to what your child is doing. Also ask questions about them - their likes/dislikes and if they are able
- Provide a good model of language to extend your child's sentence construction and vocabulary knowledge.
- If they are struggling to answer questions, guide them to the correct answer by offering prompts or giving forced alternative choices.
