Class News Robin Class






Class News Dove Class





Dove students had an incredible week. In maths, they focused on subtraction and learned to use an abacus, excelling in both areas. In science, they explored materials and textures. Class News Goldfinch Class



This week Goldfinch class has been working on number sequencing and sentence building, which was a great success. We worked on shapes and how to identify the differences between a triangle, square, circle and rectangle. The pupils found the task challenging at first but with repetition, they improved significantly. Also, we explored short sentences where we focused on capital letters, full stops, and the use of simple conjunctions.



Class News <u>Phoenix Class</u>





This week we have continued to focus on Shakespeare in Humanities. On Monday we looked at the rhythm that Shakespeare used in most of his work (iambic pentameter) and used it to come up with sentences of our own. We used our hands to create the 'duh-dum' rhythm for ten beats. We also learnt about the Globe theatre, when it was built (and rebuilt), what it looked like and how the audience viewed a performance. We then made small models of the Globe using card.

In Art we researched the life of David Hockney and learnt more about Impressionism and in Food Technology we made vegetarian chickpea burgers.

In English we have focused on comprehension skills and how to add adjectives to a sentence to make it more descriptive. We also practised editing sentences that were missing punctuation.

In line with our Attendance Policy, parents/carers must telephone the school (0203 8765076) or sent an email to admin@eagleparkschool.co.uk to inform us of the specific reason for their child's absence on each day of absence (unless the illness is prolonged, e.g. chicken pox). Symptoms must be provided; advising that children are 'sick' or 'unwell' does not give enough information. A pupil suffering from diarrhoea and/or vomiting must remain off school for 48 hours before returning. For example, if they are sent home from school on a Tuesday after being sick, they can return on Friday, provided there are no further episodes of vomiting on Wednesday or Thursday.

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
