During this week, the students in Crane Class have continued to read the story "The Gingerbread Man". Students have been responding to comprehension questions using both oral and written means in connection to the book. Throughout this term, our writing activities have centred around many key areas: articulating sentences verbally before writing, employing phonics to break down sounds for accurate spelling, incorporating finger spaces between words, and commencing the practice of composing sentences with capital letters. In addition, we have implemented the inclusion of cursive handwriting. The central theme of our painting lessons this week has revolved entirely around Christmas. We have crafted our own Christmas tree and Christmas wreaths. In mathematics, we have been performing addition and subtraction operations with integers ranging from 1 to 20. Some of our pupils have started learning the multiplication table for the number two. We have visited our nearby park for our sensory input and physical lessons. Students have derived much pleasure from strolling amidst the picturesque Autumn landscape. Students have been urged to seek out the animals featured in our narrative.


Class News Robin Class




OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY TOP TIP

Shaping

Waiting for the appropriate target behaviour or **something close to that behaviour to occur** before reinforcing the behaviour.

The goal is for **the child to brush his teeth.**Scenario: **the child is able to put some toothpaste on the toothbrush** but needs support when brushing his teeth. That itself (putting toothpaste on the toothbrush) is **a step or should be reinforced** as part of the step of brushing teeth.

SPEECH & LANGUAGE THERAPY TOP TIP





Providing a **language rich environment** facilitates the development of your child's communication skills.

MODEL rather than correct or instruct your child to say certain words, phrases and sentence structures through:

- Repeating back what your child said using the correct grammatical structures and vocabulary.
- e.g., Child "Daddy goed!" Parent "Yes, Daddy went to work"
- 2) Narrating your own or your child's actions during activities.
 - e.g., "XX is getting the rolling pin. Oh! XX is rolling the playdough."
 - 3) **Repeating specific vocabulary** in meaningful contexts e.g., "The baby is hungry. He loves to EAT. He wants to EAT the banana. EAT, baby, EAT the banana!"
